About the Presentation:

Hispanic Heritage Month is a time to recognize the contributions and influence of Hispanic Americans to the history, culture, and achievements of the United States. Pitt Pharmacy is hosting two students, Roshni Pattabiraman and Aarti Zaver, who have aimed to reduce health care barriers for these Hispanic Americans all across the country through the creation of a "Medical Spanish Program for Student Pharmacists" with the help of faculty and peers. They aim to prepare student pharmacists to care for Spanish-speaking individuals as well as anyone who identifies as Hispanic or Latinx. The program consists of an online didactic course and immersive activities to expose students to the cultural and language barriers relevant to this patient population. The program is versatile, and other health professional schools at the University of Pittsburgh would benefit from the implementation of this program.
